At the nexus of big data, governance and ethics

Deep dive conversations ignited over 2 days as 42 participants representing tech industry, governance, social innovation and tech-innovation came together to explore how we nudge tech culture and governance towards more ethical practices in tech development. Presentations from thought leaders, innovators and deeply experienced practitioners, along with open space discussion and lightning round introductions allowed for meaningful exchange among a highly diverse group. The result was rich weaving of conversation that reflected both the breadth and depth available in the room.

Cultural Elder Kelly White of Musqueam First Nation honoured ParTecK18 with a Welcoming Prayer. She stayed and participated with us for both days, gifting her wise, humourous and powerful presence to the event.

- How can AI navigate what we can not or should not measure?

- How can we encourage tech companies to take social responsibility?
- Can corporations save the world?

Survey Results

84% believe HDC has an important role in creating a culture shift towards more ethics in tech development

71% had new ideas for collaboration

97% made connections with potential collaborators / partners in fields other than their own

81% had an insight directly related to a project

90% feel a ParTecK network would be of value and would be interested in participating
